The Columbia County collection comprises 8 linear feet. It takes a historical, societal and analytical look at Columbia County from the late 18th century to the present day. The collection offers a diversity of documents accessioned by the Hudson Area Library over a period of time in order to fully describe all the phases of the evolution and construction of Columbia County from an urban, architectural, socio-economic, educational, cultural, and media perspective. The various materials and formats represented in the collection range from maps, business records, copyright documents, music compositions, newspaper clippings, scrapbooks, memorabilia and ephemera. The photographic materials consist of professional and personal photographs.

### **Arrangement**

The previous archivist organized the materials into nine subgroups and therein by series, which are arranged by folders. There is an item level container list available which lists the individual contents of each folder.
