Scope and Content Note: These black and white photographs – created within the date range of 1900s-1950s [bulk 1920s-1955] – mainly document family life and familiar and vanished streetscapes that tell a story of South Front Street life in Hudson, NY in the early-mid 20th century. The South Front Street neighborhood of Hudson was mostly demolished by Urban Renewal in the 1970s, and many of these photographs provide a view of a neighborhood that no longer exists. Most of the photos were taken by various relatives and friends of the Cipkowski family. A large portion of the photos document the childhood and teenage years of Patricia Cipkowski, who attended St Mary's Academy in Hudson, N.Y. in the 1950s. There are also a few studio portraits made in Hudson, N.Y. and in New Jersey.

Biography Note: The collection was donated by Peter Cipkowski, the grandson of Joseph (1900-1977) and Anna (1906-1984) Cipkowski, whom he visited regularly in Hudson while he was growing up in the Hudson Valley. He attended Roeliff Jansen Central School for middle school, graduating from Taconic Hills, and earning a Bachelor's degree at Bard College. He has Master's degrees in both history and education and is the author of two books published by Wiley & Sons. He served as the Hillsdale Town Historian and a Town Board Member and was the Town Supervisor from 2015-2020. He has also served on the Board of Trustees of the Columbia County Historical Society and as president of the Roeliff Jansen Historical Society. He currently lives in Los Angeles.

Joseph Cipkowski (sometimes spelled Jozef) emigrated from Poland and settled in Hudson in 1925. Anna and Joseph operated Chipp's Market, located at 39 South Front Street, from 1925, the year of their marriage, until 1970, the year urban renewal began removing buildings in Hudson. The couple lived the remainder of their lives with their son Joseph Anthony Cipkowski and his family in Copake Falls. Before owning Chipp's Market, Joseph worked at the Atlas cement plant in Hudson. Throughout his life he was an avid photographer and he amassed a large collection of photographs and home movies of family and friends.

Anna Cipkowksi was born Anna Piasta. Her mother was Marcianna Piasta (1879-1969), and she appears as Mary in some clippings. Marcianna and her husband Jan Piasta were separated after coming to Hudson in the late nineteenth century. Marcianna owned and operated a boarding house at 29 Allen Street and a home on Cross Street where she raised two daughters, Anna and Sophia. They were active members of the Polish-speaking Sacred Heart Parish.

Patricia Cipkowski (1939-2011), Peter's aunt, was raised in Chipp's Market by her parents, Anna and Joseph, with her older brothers Joseph and Edward. She attended St. Mary's Academy in the 1950s. She and her husband Alvin Middlebrook had one daughter, Marciann, who was born in 1971.
