Abstract: This collection assembles hundreds of photographs and some slides that have come into the possession of the Hudson Area Library over the years, either by donation or purchase. Photographs date from the early 1800s to the mid-2000s and depict people, places, and activities in Hudson, N.Y. as well as wider Columbia County.

Scope and Content Note: The hundreds of images in this collection, circa early-1800s to mid-2000s, depict buildings, people, sites and landscapes, homes, events, schools, infrastructure, local businesses, and community organizations, mostly in Hudson, N.Y. but also across Columbia County. The collection consists of original black-and-white and color photographic prints – including cyanotype, daguerreotype, and albumen (cartes-de-visite and cabinet cards) – as well as more recent prints of black and white prints that were originally created in the 19th century. The collection also contains a series of slides. The collection offers researchers a visual reference of life in Hudson, N.Y., especially from the mid-1800s to the early 1900s. Many of the images have original descriptive titles and notes written on them and in some cases title information at the folder level comes (in whole or part) from image titles or notes. In other cases titles have been supplied by the library (in whole or part). If the original creator of an image is known it is noted in the title in parentheses.

Acquisition information: The items in this collection were acquired by the Library either by purchase or by donation. Series 1: Arts & Entertainment, c. 1890s-1900s, 1993, 21st C (Box 1, Folders 1-5; Box 16, Folder 284)

Extent: about 33 photographs

Scope and Content: Photographs (c. 1890s-1900s, 1993, 21st C) related to the history of theater, film, and visual arts in Hudson, N.Y. and Columbia County.

Arrangement: This series is arranged without subseries.

Series 2: Government, c. 1870s-1980s (Box 2, Folders 6-19; Box 11, Folder 214; Box 14; Flat File 10, Folders 308-313)

Extent: about 68 photographs

Scope and Content: Photographs (c. 1870s-1980s) documenting the history of local governance, board of education, police, and military activity and inductions (particularly during World War I and II) in Hudson, N.Y. and Columbia County. This series contains several original and oversized prints.

Series 3: Historic Homes and Buildings, c. mid-1800s-1970s, 2015 [bulk pre-1920] (Box 3, Folders 20-74; Box 11, Folders 212-213; Box 13, Folder 215; Box 16, Folders 238-270; Flat File 10, Folder 314-315; History Room Cabinet)

Extent: about 200 photographs, 3 booklets

Scope and Content: Photographs (c. mid-1800s-1970s, 2015) of historic homes and buildings and other built landmarks such as banks, lighthouses, schools, places of worship, courthouses, and toll gates in Hudson, N.Y. and Columbia County, including sites that no longer exist or have been repurposed. This series contains original and oversized prints.

Arrangement: This series is arranged without subseries.

Series 4: Views & Landscapes, c. 1800s-1980s, 2015 (Box 4, Folders 75-99; Box 13, Folder 218; Box 16, Folders 219-237; Flat File 10, Folders 316-319)

Extent: about 127 photographs, 10 negatives

Scope and Content: Images (c. 1800s-1980s, 2015) that depict mostly landscape and cityscape in Hudson, N.Y. and Columbia County. Original and oversized prints, a small number of original negatives, as well as images of 19th and early 20th century visual art depicting the local landscape (artist unknown).

Arrangement: This series is arranged without subseries.

Series 5: Infrastructure, c. 1880-1970s (Box 5, Folders 100-113; Box 16, Folders 271-283; Flat File, Folder 320)

Extent: about 51 photographs

Scope and Content: Photos (c. 1880-1970s) depicting infrastructure and public spaces in

Hudson, N.Y. and Columbia County.

Series 6: George J. Markowitz Photograph Album, mid-1880s to mid-1900s (Box 6)

Extent: 59 photographs

Scope and Content: Black and white photographs (mid-1880s to mid-1890s) from an album created by George J. Markowitz, a resident of Hudson, N.Y. who lived at 64 Worth Ave, and who died circa 1991. Depicts the city of Hudson, N.Y. and Columbia County, notably buildings and businesses in the City of Hudson pre-Urban Renewal, construction of the Hudson Berkshire Railroad Line, parades, trains, and factories in the mid-19th to mid-20th century. These images have been scanned by the library and can also be viewed on the History Room computer. The donor requested that the photos be kept together and separate.

Arrangement: This series is arranged in the creator's original order. There are no subseries.

Series 7: Local Historical Studio Portraiture, 19th C (Box 7)

Extent: 28 photographs

Scope and Content: Cartes-de-visite and Cabinet Cards (19th C) of unidentified people, made by 19th century photograph studios located on Warren Street in Hudson, N.Y.: F. Forshew, Instantaneous Photograph Co., Sullivan Bros., Russell, and Whitbeck Studio.

Arrangement: This series is arranged alphabetically by studio name. There are no subseries.

Series 10: 1984 Columbia County Historic Resources Committee Slides, c. 1770-1880 (Box 15)

Extent: 2 slide carousels, 1 cassette tape, 1 newspaper clipping

Scope and Content: Two slide carousels containing a slide presentation depicting life in Columbia County from 1770-1880, prepared by the Columbia County Historic Resources Committee in 1984, entitled "A Family Album: Growing Up in Columbia County." The slides, and the corresponding cassette tape (included), were prepared for grade school students. They focus on family life during the Colonial period and the Victorian period and depict information about tenant farmers residing in Livingston Manor, textile mill workers in the Valatie area, and a lawyer's family in the city of Hudson. The project was created with resources from the Columbia County Historical Society's collection, area museums and historic sites, and the collections of Chatham Librarian Mary Maynard and Town of Stuyvesant Historian Priscilla Frisbee. Co-authors were Sally Botiggi and Linda Mazur, an employee of Martin Van Buren National Historic Site. A newspaper clipping (included) from *The Register-Star* on 11/04/1984 offers further background on the project.
